Darrin's Dissertation

Well, July is here again and it's time to celebrate our Independence. We are celebrating the anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. I used to think of it as sort of a break-up type of letter to the king of England, but it is so much more than that. When Jefferson wrote the famous sentence:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

He was speaking of how illogical it was to be subjects of the crown without representation. Following that chain of logic, the only remedy for the injustice of the situation was for the American people to have the right to self-govern. He continued to support that assertion with what was considered an indictment of King George III and how he mistreated the Americans. The list is long and includes no opinions or subjective statements. They were all specific and concise facts that could not be denied.

During the battles of the Revolutionary War, the officers in the Continental Army, Navy, and Marines would read the document aloud to their troops to increase morale and motivate them to continue. Learning about this made me take the time to read the document again to remind me of what it was all about.

Imagine being a soldier in a militia group fighting against the most powerful military in the world and getting frustrated with the conditions and what appears to be a losing battle. Hearing the Declaration of Independence read aloud by a leader would be a great reminder of why it is all worth it. I'm sure that when they got to the list of crimes of the crown, the troops would shout and cheer confirming its validity.

The next great document that affects us all is the Constitution. This was written to define how we govern ourselves. It defines our three equal branches of government with checks and balances in place to keep it on track. It has had a few tweaks and changes along the way starting with the Bill of Rights. Without those amendments, the Constitution would never have been ratified by all 13 States.

The point of all of this is that the Declaration of Independence defined **why** we should govern ourselves. Later, the Constitution defined **how** we would do it. I feel very blessed to inherit the society that we live in thanks to the sacrifices and fortitude of our founding fathers. When I hear people complain about our internal political issues, it reminds me of what my mother used to say- **We have the worst form of government in the world, except for all the rest of them.**

Be safe, shoot straight, and appreciate your freedom.

June Membership Meeting



Hunter Education Class 7/13/2024 & 8/10/2024 (8 am – 4 pm)

Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.



RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello everyone,

100-Yard Rifle Range - Steel Target Enclosure

You are not allowed to bring your own steel targets to hang up to shoot at. Do not place unbroken clay targets on the ground deflection berm to shoot at. It

is against the rules to shoot at any targets on the ground because a ricochet could go over the hill into our neighbor's property. You are allowed to bring your own paint to spray the targets you plan to shoot. When finished you do not need to paint any of the targets when you leave. If there are broken targets on the ground do not attempt to hang them up again.



Members: You are responsible for your guests.

Pay attention to your guests. Make sure they are complying with all the rules.

Blue Blinking Lights

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot. Then you can unload your firearms and gear.

The Green Sheets

When you sign any of the Green Sheets make sure the Date and Range information is filled in. If it is not, please fill it in.

Clean Up After Yourselves

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take a look around. Make sure you have all of your gear when you leave.

Respect the Wildlife

Watch for Turkeys and Deer on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" when wildlife is on the range.

TRAP CORNER

Notes from Rich Davis

The EF&GA is motivated by a strong group of volunteers that seems to get things done when needed. Here are some things that should be considered when helping on trap days.

Loading the House:

The targets should be handled like they are eggs when you load them in the carousel, if you drop a stack down to fill, they will fracture and/or crack. When the arm follows through to launch, you will get a broken target out of the house. 99% of broken targets are from rough loading on the stack.

The full boxes set outside the house for the next fill should be set back inside far enough so they cannot be seen from the trap line. To some it is a distraction to see the box and/or a blowing box flap while trying to shoot.

Scoring:

If you haven't scored a lot of trap, it can be a little confusing at first, but it is not difficult. When you give the unload and move command, it would be nice if you read the shooter's score on that post from 0 to five. We are not shooting to win the car to drive home in, but everyone is trying to break as many targets as they can. If a shooter disagrees with your call, they must clear it up before the next shot is fired. Also, if a target comes out of the house broken or other debris comes out with the target, the target should be shot again even if the shooter hits the broken target.

Carry Enough Ammo:

There are reasons to have a couple extra shells on your person when shooting. If you must reshoot for a broken bird out of the house, a shooter has a bad shell or the wad stays in the barrel, the shooter gets to shoot at another target and will need another round. Here is another scoring tip. If the wad clears the barrel, the shot is scored "dead" if the clay is broken or "lost" if it is missed.

These small things will help save broken targets and make the shooting a bit more fun.

- 2. Never point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- Keep your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- **4. Know** your target and the surroundings

On a different subject, we talk a lot about safety. We all know, or should know, and follow the four safety rules. We've talked about the dangers of ignorance and complacency with firearms. There is another important aspect to safety that I talk about in my classes, but you don't hear much about it anywhere else. That is attitude or mindset. Google defines mindset as "a habitual or characteristic mental attitude that determines how you will interpret and respond to situations". When you get ready to go shooting or even just pick up a firearm, are you aware of your mindset. Are you sleepy? Are you upset? Are you distracted? Can you focus on the task at hand? Do you have the proper safety mindset to be handling firearms today? These are all questions that you need to be asking yourself BEFORE you pick up a firearm. If you are not 100% sure, keep the firearms in the safe and do something else. I write this because I think it's important to understand more than just the safety rules. We need to understand what causes firearms accidents. Firearm safety does not start when you get to the range, it starts when you start planning your trip to the range.



Rendezvous

During the Fur Trade era, Trading Companies would establish a time and place for a Rendezvous each year. The Rendezvous would provide for resupply of goods not available in the Rocky Mountains. This might include replacement firearms, powder, shot, clothing as well as other manufactured goods. Recreational beverages and women of negotiable virtue were frequently present as well.

This last weekend of June 15th and 16th we held our annual Guejito Rendezvous at the range. (Sorry, but no recreational beverages or professional women showed up.) This contest is a two day endurance test (mostly for the shoot chair). We began Saturday morning with a nine target walk-thru event for Muzzle Loading rifle. All targets were at an "unknown" distance (as long as you didn't look too closely at the range markers) and our Mountain Men could shoot twice at each target. Actual distances were roughly 25 to 125 yards with one point per hit and 18 points possible. After rifle, we moved on to Single Shot Pistol (with targets moved to a shorter distance). Actual distances were 15 to 60 yards. Following Pistol we moved to the campground to make 10 throws with a Tomahawk, and 10 throws with a Knife. Sticking the Hawk or Knife earned you 1 point. In the center of the target was a printed playing card. If you hit the card it was worth 3 points. Finally, for Saturday we had a fire starting contest. Traditional Flint and Steel were used to ignite a small birds nest of flammable bark and lint. Winning times were in the 9 to 16 seconds range.


