RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello Everyone

Shotgun (Patterning Stand)

Do not use shotgun slugs when using the patterning stand. No shot larger than #4 shall be used. Follow all the Pattern Stand Rules and Instructions when using it.

100 Yard Range

A sign and a bell have been installed at the end of the fence on the left side of the 100 yard range. It reads "Please use bell to get attention of any trap shooters before proceeding down range". Ring the bell to let anyone on the Trap Range know that you want to go down range for target backer placement or retrieval.

Pistol Range

If target backers are placed on the firing line benches or center tables to staple targets on, make sure that staples do not go through and are left sticking up for someone else to get hurt.

Range is Cold - Blue Lights Blinking

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear from your car. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot and then you can unload your firearms and gear.

Targets and Target Backers

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take your used targets home for disposal. HAZMAT regulation!

Make Sure You Have Everything When You Leave

Take a look around. Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, goes back home with you.

Want to be an RSO?

If you are a member of Escondido Fish & Game Association and you are interested in becoming a Rangemaster/RSO contact me and we can talk about the requirements.

We will be offering an RSO Class and First Aid Class in the near future. The RSO Class will cost \$150 + \$25 for a shirt and \$25 for an RSO hat. The cost will be reimbursed if you serve 5 hours a month for a year. The First Aid Class will include First Aid, Stop the Bleed, AED and CPR. It will cost \$55.



Please use bell to get attention of any trap shooters before proceeding down range.

Guests

Members pay attention to your guests. They are your responsibility.

The Green Sheets

I know this is redundant, but Green Sheets are **STILL** being turned in without the Date and Range information filled in. Please make sure the Date and Range information is filled in on any sheet you sign.

Wildlife

Watch for turkeys, deer and other wildlife on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" if they wander onto the range. There is to be no shooting when wildlife is present.
















NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class

Bow Hunter Education Class

The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.
