Darrín's Dissertation

When I first became a member of EF&GA, there was no requirement for volunteer hours by new members. I just wanted a nice outdoor place to shoot and didn't have any interest in any of the organized events, operation of the Association, or much of anything else. I enjoyed a lot of pistol and rifle shooting and was thinking about taking up shotgun, but I mostly came out on my days off from work and enjoyed the peace and quiet of the Range on weekdays.

One day I was shooting on the Pistol Range and having fun but not doing great. A gentleman in a wheelchair offered me a few pointers and tips to improve my grip and stance. In a very short period of time my marksmanship improved dramatically. I was stunned that such minor adjustments (from someone who knows how to coach) made such a difference. As we talked for the next hour or two, he somehow talked me into going to a Work Party a week later. I had never been to one of them and didn't know what to expect but he told me that it included a free lunch that was always great.

When I showed up at the Work Party, there were about 40 people raking down the broken clay targets and shoveling them into tractor buckets. Looking at the size of the hill and how much orange debris was all over it, the task looked huge, but I figured that I had the skills (strong back, weak mind) to contribute to the project. In just a few hours, we had the entire hill cleaned and spotless. I was amazed at how much we accomplished in such a short period of time.

My day job is in government, and I never see that much measurable change completed so fast. All of our projects at work are saturated with politicians, committees, media, and at least a dozen people standing around complaining that something didn't feel right. In contrast, the EF&GA Work Party was just a bunch of EF&GA Members getting together with a simple, common goal – make the Range beautiful. I was motivated and excited to be part of it.

We hold four Work Parties each year and I have not missed a single one since that first one. I have met lots of other EF&GA members who got me into lots of activities like the Combat Match, Trap, 5-Stand, the AR-15 Match, etc. The list goes on and on. I also got drawn into the Junior Marksmanship events when my son was in high school. I learned how great it is to coach a kid and see them light up when they start to have success with a firearm.

Back to that gentleman (and I use the term loosely) in the wheelchair who helped me with my pistol fundamentals. Later I learned that he was the president of EF&GA, **Kurt Nelson**. He was very approachable, polite, and humble. He also has a warped sense of humor that makes me think that we may be related or something. The more I got involved with EF&GA, the more he encouraged me to take on more responsibility. The next thing I knew, I was running for a director position on the Board of Directors. While serving on the board I got to work with lots of other Board members, presidents, vice presidents, secretaries, directors, shoot chairs, and other Association Members. We never agreed on everything, but we always worked together to protect and improve our Association. I learned many lessons from serving on the Board and consider it an honor to be counted among those whom I have served with.

Muzzle Loading Trade Gun Contest

FAQ: A "Walk-Thru" event means that we will have gong targets set up in the field at "unknown" distances. You walk from shooting station to shooting station, to take two shots at each target. The number of targets set out will be determined by how much help shows up at 06:15 to help me. We will be trying for 5 Trade Gun targets on Saturday and 9 Rifle/Pistol targets on Sunday.

Rifle will be shot at 50, 75 and 100 yards. Rifle starts at 10:00. Standard entry fee of \$1 for Pistol, \$5 for EF&GA members, \$10 for non-members.
