The Junior Muzzle Loading program is designed to teach our junior shooters how to properly and safely handle a Muzzle Loading rifle. Shooters need not bring anything, except themselves and a parent or legal guardian. Minors can attend with a non-parent or legal guardian with a valid signed and dated parent permission slip.

Escondido Fish and Game Association will provide everything else!

• All equipment required for the Muzzle Loading rifle match (including rifles, ammunition, eye and ear protection etc.) is supplied by EF&GA

• A coach for each shooter on the line.

Shooters are allowed to use their own Muzzle Loading rifles and equipment, if they so desire. The course of fire consists of 7 rounds fired. The best 5 shots will be scored for record at a distance of 25 yards. All firing will be conducted from the bench rest position.

## **Safety Class**

We offer a safety/familiarization class for our new and beginning shooters. All new shooters to the Jr. Muzzle Loading rifle program must go through the class (once) before being allowed to shoot.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

We have discussed several times what a Hot and Cold range is; but who is responsible to call the firing line Hot or Cold? It all depends on whether you are there for casual shooting versus an organized match.

At an organized match the shoot chair (match director) or his/her designated match officials (Range Safety Officers) control the shooting line and when you may load your firearm(s).

The Blue safety lights may or may not be used depending on the shooting activity and how that shoot is organized. The shoot chair is responsible for safety at his/her shoot and is answerable to the CRSO and BOD for safe range use.

I have observed almost every organized shoot at our range except the BB/Pellet match - so "don't shoot your eye out" guys... All our shoot chairs are approved by the BOD and are required to attend RSO training (with me, pour souls). If you have any concerns about our organized shoots, please let me know.

For casual shooting you and the other shooters are the Range Safety Officer on that range and should coordinate going Hot or Cold. The RSO on duty is there to manage the entire facility and not one particular range.

There are times when the on duty RSO may assist in calling a range Hot or Cold to aid the flow of shooting (targets up or down). Usually we mostly observe the shooting line and point of impact to insure safety first. If you do need our assistance, please do not hesitate to ask, we only bite a little bit...

One of the joys of having firearms is the ability to really learn how to use them and not just come out and *plink*. To become proficient you need muscle memory (time behind the trigger) and we have a large selection of organized shoots that will allow you to improve your shooting skills with your chosen firearm(s).

All of our shoots are open to all levels and we welcome beginning shooters. You do not need to be a "Top" shooter to come out and have fun. Contact the shoot chair of the discipline you are interested in for more information on gear, ammo and what is needed to play. Better yet, come out to their next match to watch and talk to the shooters.

Besides our organized matches to improve your shooting skills, we also have several firearm classes by great instructors in Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun, Reloading, Home Safety, Self Protection and classes just for women. These classes consist of classroom and hands on instruction (live fire) that will help make you a better shooter. I had one pistol student (not a novice) who had an epiphany once he understood that you focus on the front sight, not the target! Also his shooting got better.

As I have mentioned we are all Safety Officers on the range and in particular this time of year with all the green grass – watch out for wild life, in particular deer and turkey walking across the firing line while you are shooting...

Just to be clear, there is no "accidentally" shooting that 10 point buck, or awesome gobbler, and regretfully the gophers are also off limits...

## How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

**Members Only** are allowed to submit Classified advertisements. Your Membership Number must be included with any advertisement request so that we can properly vet the submission before it is published. The Membership Number will NOT appear in the advertisement. Your Membership Number is on your membership badge on the same side as your photo.

**No Illegal Transactions** may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:** 

**Category –** Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

**Subject/Title** – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

**Description** – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

**Price** – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

**Contact Info** – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

Last Contest: On 1/27/2019, we had 12 shooters in the pistol class and 15 shooters in the rifle class. All competed on the Super Short Course with targets at 25, 50 and 75 yards. Ren Everett won the Open Class with a score of 16 out of 18. Tom Arendell won the Primitive Class with a perfect 18 out of 18. Just to make a point about it, he now has four possible's, (perfect scores), over the last 40 years. Just to hammer the point home, he shoots in primitive class. This requires fixed, non-adjustable sights, loading from a pouch on the firing line, and he chooses to shoot a flintlock. Not bad for a "Mature Marine." Next Contest: Will be on March 24th. This will be a Mid-Range contest with targets at 75, 100, and 125 yards. What's Ahead: April marks the 40th year we have been shooting Muzzle-Loading Silhouette at the range. For April, we will have a special contest laid out for Pistol and Rifle categories. This will be a "Walk Through" contest where you move from station to station, to shoot at gong targets at "unknown distances." There is a MASSIVE trophy waiting for the high score rifle winner. BPCR shooters are welcome to compete, but will NOT be eligible for the overall win in rifle. (Note: for this contest you can load from the bench OR from a pouch, subject to safety restrictions - we will NOT be shooting from the range house.) How to Clear a Dry-Ball: With a number of new shooters this year we are experiencing a number of Dry Ball situations. A Dry Ball is loading your muzzle loader with a patch and ball, but without the powder. Everybody has done it at one time or another and we will ALL tease you about it. The very best way to avoid dry-balling is to have a mental check-list for your loading procedure, and don't allow yourself to get distracted during the loading process. Failing that, there are several ways to fix it. In a percussion rifle you can remove the nipple, sprinkle 4f priming powder down the flash hole, shake the rifle and repeat until the powder is up to where the base of the nipple will be. Carefully screw the nipple back in place being careful to not cross-thread it. Seat the ball with your ramrod so it is firmly on the powder you sprinkled into the chamber, step to the line, cap and shoot it out downrange. It should plop out down range about 30 yards or so. If it does not clear the barrel, repeat the steps above with more powder, seat the ball again and have at it until it shoots clear. If the above procedure does not work, or if you have a flintlock, another option is to use a Co2 clearing devise. It comes with a variety of adapters for nipples or vents. I have one with me at the range during the contest to use as a second to last resort when you get desperate. Finally we have the least desirable method based on what the real mountain men used back in the day. This is a ball screw. Literally it is a steel screw adapter that attaches to the end of your ramrod. You run the ramrod down the barrel, lightly tap it with a rubber mallet,

and twist the ramrod to screw into the lead ball. When you feel it is screwed in as far as it will reasonably go, you get three friends to help you pull on the ramrod one way and pull on the rifle the other way. If your rifle is full of fouling, this can be quite a task. Generous amounts of oil or other lubricant sometimes helps. That's all for now. See you at the range.
