RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Going down range to check or paste up a target is certainly common enough, however doing so while there is a loaded firearm on the bench is about the biggest rule infringement that a shooter can make while on an EF&GA range! But folks it keeps happening and there is no excuse for it other than pure negligence. Negligent handling of a firearm is a mistake that should never happen and can so easily wind up with disastrous results. You might as well volunteer to become a human target because when you go down range when there is a loaded firearm on the bench you have just become a target.

RSO Notes: RSOs signing up for Range Duty continues to be a problem. Effective immediately, all RSOs should call the Chief Range Master upon reporting for duty. I will see that you are properly logged in. It is important to know who has the duty at any given time when important information needs to be passed on. If you have figured out how to log-in already call anyway. It would help me to to update my phone log.

The long and short sleeve shirts that many RSOs like to purchase and wear are running out, especially in the larger sizes. That means it is time to place another order. If you are interested in purchasing a "Bob Allen" shirt please let me know so that I can get enough of the larger, "husky "sizes.

EF&GA has begun a new Muzzle Loader shoot designed to encourage more youngsters to get involved in Black Powder shooting. The first go-a-round proved to be a rousing success. These old style firearms are amazingly accurate and a heck of a lot of fun to shoot. Certainly we need to get the kids involved, but truth be told Black Powder Shoots have plenty of room for those of us with a few more years under our belt. I have it on good authority that EF&GA has one of the best black powder "shoot offerings" available in the entire country. Garth Warner, the new shoot chair, is breathing new life into the sport. NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (5/6/2017)

Ammunition has plentifully come back to the market but we will soon be dealing with additional complications when we attempt to purchase ammunition in the stores as well as the elimination of online purchases due to the new laws in California. Besides the availability concerns, are you getting the accuracy and precision that you and your rifle are capable of? The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent, accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on May 6th, 2017.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session will begin at 8:00 AM on Saturday, May 6th, 2017 and will last until approximately 12 noon. The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.

The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$100; non-members = \$110. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

RULES TO LIVE BY

1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded.

2. Never point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot

3. Keep your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire

4. Keep your firearm on safe until you intend to fire.

Anyone that has spent anytime around the Jr Marksmanship program or the military knows these safety rules well. They cover the very fundamentals of firearms safety. These rules are repeated, many times, at every Jr Marksmanship event, not only at the safety class but during every safety brief, as well. Many of the Jr shooters can say them verbatim.

Well, starting now we will be changing the last rule. From now on, the fourth rule will be "Know your target and the surrounding". The reason for the change is due to the fact that many firearms today, do not have a manual safety that can be switched on or off between shots. While the practice of keeping the firearm on safe will still be taught, it will not be a part four safety rules.

By changing the rule, we are emphasizing the need to always be aware of not only the target but also everything around that target. That includes everything to the left and right of the target as well as everything beyond the target. At Escondido Fish and Game, we are lucky to have a huge hillside as our back stop. But, it is still important to know that there is always the possibility of someone or something walking into the range during live fire.

Black Powder Steel - For Sale

Shooting steel has been popular in a number of disciplines for quite awhile now. Outside of scheduled events we can NOT currently shoot steel at our range. HOWEVER, if you have a home range, or someplace you can shoot steel safely, I may have a deal for you.
