Class Description:

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

Class Description:





NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 12/7/2024 (8:00 am - 12:00 noon)

Ammunition is hard enough to find and expensive enough. Is there any better reason to learn to reload your own ammunition?

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

Bow Hunter Education Class 12/14/2024 (8:00 am -4:00 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and guiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Hello Everyone,

Last month there was a sign installed on the Trap Range on Trap Pad 3 that reads (Trap Pad 3 closed when 100 yard range

is open) to remind shooters that when the 100 Yard Range is open, do not use Trap Pad 3. The concern is that when someone is shooting from the far right benches on the 100 yard range and someone would be shooting from the far right shooting position on Trap pad 3, there would be the possibility of an accident. For Casual Shooting, the Pistol Range, Trap Range and 100 Yard Rifle Range are all open at the same time unless there is a sanctioned event going on.

For Casual Shooting on the 150 Yard Rifle Range, do not use the 15 yard and 25 yard target butts (concrete target backer holders). There are signs posted to not use them. Do not place targets in between the posted signs and shoot from those distances.

Guests

Members are responsible for their guests. You are allowed to bring two guests to the range with you. Pay attention to them at all times. If they are not in compliance with our safety rules, it is your responsibility to correct. If they can not be corrected, it's time to head home and that guest should be removed from your guest list.

Blinking Blue Lights

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot (blue lights off). Then you can unload your firearms and gear. The chart in the upper right corner of this page should help you keep the lights protocol straight.

The Green Sheets

Sign the Green Sheets when you arrive at each range. Check to make sure the "Date" and "Range" lines are filled in. If not, fill them in, please. There are still Green Sheets being turned in without "Date" and "Range" information.

House Keeping

All shooters must remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take your targets home to discard. Look around and make sure you have all of your guns and gear.



Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT Handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep Up Brass Behind the Yellow and In Front of the Red Line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights OFF
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red Line Only

DO NOT GO DOWN RANGE

Wildlife

As always, watch for turkeys, deer and any other wildlife on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" and wait for the visitors to leave.





MuzzleLoading Bullseye - Contest results 10/6/2024

This will be somewhat challenging to report and describe as it was held as a Non-Standard contest shoot. To begin with, we shot a rifle event followed by a pistol event, both of which had standalone winners and combined winners. This was followed by a double elimination bloodless duel for pistol.

The Rifle event was shot with one round at 15, 25, 50, 75 and 100 yards. The Pistol event was shot with one round at 15, 25 and 50 yards. The target consisted of a white paper plate (representing a Whiskey Bottle) worth 5 points. Below the paper plate was a somewhat smaller rectangular area worth 4 points. Below that was a considerably larger rectangular area worth 3 points. The object of the contest was to score as many points as possible by placing a round ball in one of the designated areas at each distance. Outside of these areas earned a zero.

You could only shoot one ball at each range, so you had to evaluate your skill to take the highest scoring shots at the closer distances, and take the easier lower scoring shots at the longer distances. Because you had to walk out and move the targets after each shot, you knew what the other guys were scoring. On the next shot you had to evaluate whether or not you needed to risk a higher scoring shot on a smaller target at a longer distance, or if you could safely pick up three points in the larger scoring area. In short, you needed to evaluate your skill, your equipment, and do some math, each time you stepped to the line.

When we finished with Rifle we did the same thing with pistol, although with only 3 rounds. (Should have added a 75 yard target.) Scoring broke down as follows.

We then ran a double elimination bloodless duel sequence. Originally set up at 15 yards, we were forced to move to 10 yards after numerous shooters managed to miss a watermelon size target in their haste to get a round off. (Repeatedly).

Jerry Strauss managed to squeak by **David Premetz** for the win. All in all we had fun in the heat without overdoing it.

SMALL TARGET LONG DISTANCE BENCH SILHOUETTE

(for lack of a better name) by Jim McKim

A new version of Smallbore Rifle Silhouette has been added to the monthly match. It involves shooting 1/10 scale targets at 75-150 yards from a bench with a front rest only (block, bag, bipod, adjustable rest, etc.) with any .22LR rifle; standard NRA smallbore rifle silhouette is done with 1/5 scale targets at 40-100 meters offhand (standing). This is for rimfire benchrest shooters who want to shoot metallic knockdown targets for the same satisfying reason I like shooting NRA-style silhouette, but not offhand. We made it difficult enough with the target sizes and distances to be challenging, especially with any wind. To consistently hit the targets you will need a decent rifle, scope and ammunition, but just as (or more) important, you will need your "dope" for the four different distances and be able to read the wind.

Silhouette involves four different animal target shapes: chickens, pigs, turkeys, and rams, shot at increasing distances. "1/10" scale refers to the targets as being one-tenth the size of those used for high power rifle silhouette, and is the same as that used for air pistol and rifle silhouette. While the outline of each animal is irrregular, making it difficult to describe their size, a 1/10 chicken is ~1"x1", a pig 1.5"x2", a turkey 2"x2" and a ram 2"x3". These will be placed at 75, 100, 125 and 150 yards respectively. Those numbers translate to roughly 1.5 MOA. Fortunately, any hit on a nose, tail, leg or even the base is usually just as effective at knocking a target over as that of a center of mass hit! There are ten of each target shape, for a total of 40. Shooters get one shot per target, "hit or miss, move on". Details can be found at https://escondidofishandgame.com/events/smallbore-rifle-silhouette

I am also opening up the NRA-style course to anyone who wants to shoot from the bench. This should be considerably easier than either offhand or the ST/LD bench version . With the right setup and reasonable skill a shooter should be able to hit 100% or close to it. Scores for this will be reported in a separate category.
