RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

have written about this subject as I am sure many of you may remember. Also let me be clear up front that it is not my intention to embarrass the individuals involved, but it needs to be made clear once again, that the EF&GA commitment to safety is not one that I take lightly.

1. When anyone goes down range to check/paste up targets it is imperative that every firearm has first been cleared and made safe. That means an empty chamber showing and all ammunition/magazines removed. Failure to do so can mean that anyone

failing to do so may be asked to leave the range immediately. In more blatant cases the member's card could be pulled and the member could be ordered to report to the Board of Directors for further discipline. When the BOD gets involved there can be some serious implications so to the greatest extent possible I try to handle them at the CRSO level. Try to keep an "empty chamber indicator" handy and use them. It can save everyone a bit of grief if not embarrassment.

2. The use of any ammunition which can be attracted to a magnet is forbidden on all EF&GA ranges. A magnet is provided on all long gun ranges and all ammo should be checked prior to firing. Any RSO who finds such ammo being used is authorized to have it removed from the range immediately. He/she may have you REMOVE it from the range and not just put it back into your vehicle.

3. When using the pistol range people often like to bring more than a single caliber with them. While it is not mandatory it is strongly suggested that each caliber and associated ammunition be well segregated. Oftentimes similar caliber ammunition can be placed into the wrong firearm. It might not be a problem, but then it could just as easily become a problem that can be avoided.

4. Sweeping the range means that you have broken one of the first rules of firearm safety. That is "always keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction". If you are keeping extra firearms on the table behind the firing line, they ideally should be cased and safe as though you were going downrange as mentioned above. When bringing another firearm to the firing line do not remove it from its case until you are back on the firing line.

5. Make certain that you follow these rules, make certain that your kids have these rules drummed into their heads and make certain that all of your guests follow these simple safety rules. In fact it is always a good idea to give your guests a little schooling on our range etiquette before anyone starts shooting. All ranges do not observe all the rules that EF&GA does and the member is responsible for the action of his/her guests. We want you and your guests to have an enjoyable time shooting. Having a good time just needs to be tempered with a safe shoot for everyone on our range.

RULES TO LIVE BY

- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- **2. Never** point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- 4. Know your target and the surroundings

I would like to thank Ken Halbert and Chris Cote for rewriting the safety brief and working with the Jr. Coaches to make sure that they are able to give the best safety brief possible. I would also like to recognize the two senior Jr. Coaches, Grace Bresnahan and AJ Wagle. These two individuals are the ones that make it all happen. These two make sure that the range is ready to go before the first relay and they prep the line between relays to make sure that all shooting positions are clean and stocked. Did I mention that they started doing this on their own? They have taken the initiative, with the help of the other Jr. Coaches, to ensure that everything is ready to go. These two truly lead by example. If you couldn't tell, I'm extremely proud of both of them.

The Jr. Marksmanship program would like to congratulate Miss Daysha Halbert for her first Distinguished Shooter Award. I know that she and her grandfather, Ken Halbert have been working on this for a long time. Their hard work and dedication is paying off. How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

Hello Again.

I survived surgery on my knee and now I can actually walk again,. Life is good. I would like to offer special recognition and thanks to Ren Everett for running the August contest in my absence. Ren runs the Junior Rifle program, writes grant requests, participates in a number of other events, while working a full time job and being a full time Dad. I really appreciate him taking on the burden of running another contest during my absence. Thank you Ren,

Upcoming events: October will be our regular Short Range Silhouette contest with targets at 50, 75, and 100 yards. November will be our first "Across the Course" contest with 3 targets at each range from 25 to 150 yards. Note that because of the increasing popularity of Black Powder Pistol and Revolver competition, the start time for this event has been moved up to 08:30. The Rifle portion should start at 10:00.

Our editor has informed me that the following article was too long to fit the format for the standard newsletter. This time around, I am breaking it up into smaller sections. Part 1 was in August if you missed it. You can find it in the newsletter section of our webpage if you are interested.

Practical Black Powder Accuracy: Part 2

Last month I was blowing some smoke on how well you could get your muzzle loading rifle to shoot at 100 yards. This month I will talk you through the procedure to get there. Note: All of the following is my opinion, based on a lot of reading and many practical experiments. Your mileage may vary. To begin with, you need to understand that everything in a black powder rifle is a variable. You need to learn to control the individual variables your specific rifle. Never change more than one variable at time while experimenting. Your rifle will tell you what works, and what does not. To make this happen, you're going to need a couple of things. The first is a Micrometer to measure balls and patches. Harbor Freight sells a (Pittsburgh) 0-1" Digital Micrometer, (Item # 895), for about \$25. It's cheap and it works, but I am sure there are other brands out there. For those of you that don't know, a micrometer looks like a C-clamp with an adjustable spindle handle. It has a digital readout. It measures thickness in thousandths of an inch. We are going to use it to measure patch thickness and compressibility. More on that next month.

Second, you will need a rifle rest, or some way to shoot consistently from a bench. It doesn't need to be fancy, but you need to be able to shoot consistently from string to string.

For this test use the rifle that you have. Not all rifle bores are the same. I have two .50 caliber Green Mountain barrels that have a bore diameter slightly over .50 caliber, with relatively shallow lands. I have another Browning barrel that has a bore that measures exactly .50, but with substantial taller lands. Both are .50 caliber rifles and both will shoot the same .495 balls, but need different patches to be accurate. The barrels have different twist rates, but we will discuss that later.

You will need one pound of 2F or 3F black powder. A popular rule of thumb is 3F powder below .50 Caliber and 2F powder over .50 caliber. A "Rule of Thumb" is the SWAG method of determining where to start with what. If you are so inclined, you can try both. I have. My Green Mountain barrel likes 3F powder. My Browning barrel will only shoot 2F powder accurately. For this test, let's use 2F. You can try 3F in your rifle later in the program.

Next, we need targets, butcher paper, or brown wrapping paper. We will be testing at 75 yards, so pick a single point target that you can see consistently at that distance. An NRA B-19 target center works well for this, but use something YOU can see clearly. Paper plates spray painted black work equally well and are extremely affordable. Cover the foam core range target face with a 24"x24" sheet of butcher paper or brown wrapping paper. (The butcher paper or brown wrapping paper allows you can see each fresh bullet strike at 75 yards). Staple your single bullseye

target in the center. Collect a variety of patching material in a variety of thicknesses. Start with .10. .15, .18, .20, .22 and .24 thicknesses. Here is where the Micrometer comes in. Lots of companies sell lubricated or dry patches. Some of them even list the thickness. All of them are expensive. Besides being OCD, I am frugal, (cheap). Take your micrometer and start making the rounds of the fabric stores. You are looking for cotton Pillow Ticking as a first choice. Cotton linen, cotton denim, or osnaberg as second choices. Do not EVER use artificial fiber material as it melts in your barrel. In Escondido that would be Joann's, The Fabric Store, Walmart (east), and occasionally Hobby Lobby in San Marcos. Pillow ticking is not as popular in SoCal as it is back in Amish country. You really need to look around to find it. Selection, (thicknesses), are often limited. If you know of other outlets that carry pillow ticking in San Diego County share with me and I will publish for the benefit of all of our black powder shooters. Now, you can drive the female store clerks nuts, by pulling down a bolt of cloth, and measuring it in several places along the edge. The thickness may vary a bit, but take an average. If they ask you what you are doing, tell them it's for a craft project. (Saves 20 minutes of conversation with them thinking that you're a "gun nut"). Better yet, stop by a fabric store on the way home after a black powder range session. The smell of sulfur makes the most inquisitive ladies back off a bit. Find what you want and buy a yard or less. Take it home and run it through the washer once to get the sizing out of it. You WILL end up with material left over that didn't work for you, sell it or trade it to the next guy, to try in his rifle. Trading patch material is a popular pastime at contests and camps. If you buy pre-cut patches try the dry, non-lubed patches first. For .50 caliber 1-1/8" Diameter to 1-1/4" Diameter is about right. Smaller than that and you run the risk of shooting the ball out of the patch and having it rattle down the barrel. Larger will make it hard to center when you seat the ball and cause accuracy problems at long distance. If you are using uncut fabric, tear a strip about 1-3/4" wide wide and about 12" to 18" long (More on this later).

Now we need to pick a patch lube. Start with what you have, spit, liquid patch lube, or grease patch lube. We can discuss the pros and cons of each next month. Assemble the gear and supplies that you need to shoot.

Get ready to do some testing, (shooting). Thank you,
