Neil served EF&GA in every elected position of the Board – Director, Secretary, Vice President, and President. While he served in each of those positions, he learned many skills and tribal knowledge about the Association. He also served as a mentor to others serving in those same positions. One of his greatest talents in that capacity is that he did not expect or require me to agree with his opinions on any policy or decision, but he was always willing to refer to the proper chapter and verse in the Bylaws to guide us in the correct method to execute any policy, procedure, or decision that the Board was faced with. I will truly miss his candor and counsel in those situations in the future.

Neil also served the Association in many other ways. He served on countless committees and was among the first of the RSOs (Range Safety Officers) in the Association. He helped draft, write, and refine our RSO Policies and Procedures that are still in use today. Other ranges including Police and Sheriff ranges have used that template for their own P&Ps. He also served as an NRA instructor for many disciplines including training many NRA Certified RSOs.

Neil worked with Ed Migdal for many years to run, improve, and refine the annual Barbecue into our biggest event of the year. He also started and continued to chair the committee for the Junior Marksmanship Sponsorship Banner that has helped fund the ammunition and food for the Junior Marksmanship events – that he also helped run and operate in any way that he possibly could. His passion for promoting our youth in the Association led to the creation of the Escondido Fish and Game Association Scholarship Fund Award that is delivered every year.

One of Neil's passions was history. Not only did he want to learn what happened and when it happened but also how it worked. This got him into black powder muzzle loading, reenactments, and SPAR (Society of Primitive American Riflemen). He will truly be missed by his many fellow black powder associates.

Neil served our Nation in the United States Navy including operations in Vietnam. He then served the people of New York as a Port Authority Police Officer. He also served the Department by competing on their Pistol team.

In his 'spare time' Neil was involved in 'Theatre'. He would have required that I spell it that way because a 'theater' is where you go to see a movie. 'Theatre' is an art form, not a building. He was involved in many facets of Theatre production as an actor and a playwright.

Those of us that had the honor of working, competing, and having fun with him will now have to deal with the void left behind in his absence. I plan to keep his memory alive by remembering the great features of this man. When dealing with Association policy and decisions, I will be asking myself, "What would Neil have to say about this one?"

Please remember Neil and his family in your thoughts and prayers.

NRA BASIC METALLIC CARTRIDGE RELOADING COURSE

10/2/2021, 11/6/2021 & 12/4/2021 (1st Session 8 am – Noon)

Class Description:

Need or want ammo but can't find any and mailing is not an option? You're left with an old American skill; self-sufficiency and creativity...Make your own!

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall from 8 AM until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands On" Training held at the reloading bench scheduled for a mutually agreed upon time and date. You will reload your own cartridges and produce ammunition that day.



The Elephant Missing from the Room

We have all noticed that there are fewer people out shooting Trap and 5-Stand lately. Pot continues to have a good crowd and it has become apparent that the missing piece of the puzzle is ammunition. Before the pandemic, we would go to Wal-Mart and buy the 100 packs of the cheap stuff for around \$25 after tax and continue on our merry way. Now Wal-Mart has stopped selling ammunition in California and the other big-box stores are selling at more than double the price – if they have it at all. Those of us that have continued to shoot during the pandemic have either stockpiled ammunition for years or taken to reloading. Those of us that reload are now working hard to keep components on hand and we have been tuning and refining our processes to make an excellent product. There is a different level of satisfaction and joy when you shoot 25 straight with your own reloads.

This brings up a critical issue. Reloading can be an economical way to feed the beast but it can also be very dangerous if you don't take the proper precautions. This means that YouTube is NOT real instruction or training. This is like skydiving. You don't get a second chance to get it right if you do it wrong the first time. Like with anything else involving firearms, mistakes can cost fingers, limbs, or lives. I started reloading by taking an NRA class on reloading to learn the basics. The class that I took was on metallic cartridge reloading and it taught me a lot about making a consistent load that begins with a published recipe with NO substitutions. I learned about burn rates, components, and procedures to make a safe and accurate product. Between the Lyman's book and the web sites of the powder manufacturers, I was on my way. I also learned to ask lots of questions to people that have been reloading for a long time. When they offer their opinions about various components (powders, wads, hulls, shot, presses) they are all working from the starting point of published, safe, and tested recipes. If you are asking questions WITHOUT the base knowledge (i.e. the Lyman's book), you could be setting yourself up for an unsafe situation. That unsafe situation could cost fingers, hands, eyeballs, or a life. This is not just your own risk but also the person standing next to you on the line.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Over the last few months I have participated in the New Members Orientation to a large and eager group of range “newbies”. I don’t necessarily mean new shooters, but new members at this range who need to learn our rules and regulations. Some have gone blind trying to read all of our signs.

So what I am asking all of you (remember you are all RSOs) is to assist our new members and your guests with learning our procedures. If you see them doing something incorrect, please introduce yourself and help them understand how not to get hollered at and tasered. (one target on the short pistol range) The default state at the range is HOT (lights Off), just like any firearm is always loaded until you verify otherwise. It is an exception when the range is COLD (lights On) and everyone at that range should be cognizant that there is a cease-fire and no handling of firearms and equipment. When you arrive at the range, ensure that the range is HOT before removing your cased firearm(s) from your vehicle. I don’t know about you, but I don’t like it when someone is messing with a firearm behind my back! I have to prevent myself from spinning around and doing a cowboy quick draw. I would like to explain what we consider the proper way to unload and load your firearm(s). I am not referring to the round in the chamber (this time), but the bag/case you brought it in.

Your firearm should be unloaded from your bag/case on the firing line bench/table (pointed down range), not the bench/table behind the firing line. Rifles should be unloaded in this fashion and then placed in the rack if that is its eventual destination. You then reverse the process to load your firearm back into its bag/case.

If you are not following these procedures you are probably “sweeping” other shooters on the range, which is a major safety violation. Just saying.

Unload/load your firearm into/out of the bag/case on the firing line with the firearm pointed down range.

I also want to remind you that everyone is an RSO regardless of whether you have a Red Hat. If you see another member doing something unsafe, please politely remind them. If that does not work, please send me an email with the details. The Board convenes a special inquisition for those who violate our safety rules.

It’s that time of the year to be on the lookout for “It’s the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown”.

- Blue Blinking Lights **ON**
- **DO NOT** handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

Hot Range:

- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

Around The Range

FUZZY SCOPE?

The target is set. Your front rests are positioned. So you sit down and you bring the scope up to your eye. "I need to focus!" I have seen many do this. They inadvertently tend to bring the target in focus with their ocular (the closest ring to the eye) adjustment.

Scopes come in many configurations but one commonality is that the ocular ring is designed to adjust the diopter setting for your individual eyesight. This adjustment is primarily designed so that the individual will have a sharp reticle (crosshair) to aim by. One good example of this was when a person's (no name given) young daughter stopped shooting and let her father take the firearm to shoot...he exclaimed, "how do you see anything out of this scope? The crosshairs look like they're made of yarn."

The father's eyesight wasn't the equal of youth's sharp vision. He needed to adjust the eyepiece (ocular) lens to the diopter setting which would allow him to see the reticle sharply. Now, for him to see the target just as sharply in focus he would have to turn the ring at the front of the scope (objective lens). Some scopes have a front ring and some have a side focus dial. Many inexpensive scopes are of a fixed focus type and have no adjustments other than the ocular. Along with focus at the objective, there is also a dynamic which takes place simultaneously known as "parallax". That's a subject for another time. (...or another column?)

EFFICIENT ZEROING

As the majority of us are aware, ammo has become a commodity that is no longer easy to come by. Whether it be scarcity, cost or outright denial to it, it all boils down to one thing...make every shot count. Conserve. There is a technique for zeroing with as little as 3 shots that will place you on paper to fine tune. The main requirement is some form of rest that will maintain the position of your rifle after the 1st shot. (The following assumes you understand the workings of your scope.)

1. Set your target down range at either 50 or 100 yards. Low powered scopes would be better suited to 50 yards. Use a clean target backer if possible.
2. Firm up your rifle so it will hold position...scope adjustment is to be made from this position.
3. Fire one round, aiming at center of target, Locate the point of impact through the scope (without moving the rifle). It should be visible.
4. Remove the scope adjustment covers (if the scope has them). As an example, let's surmise your initial shot impacted the target at the 5:00 position. That would indicate that you are sighted low and right. With your cross hairs still on the center of the target rotate your elevation knob in the "UP" direction (Yes, that's the right direction) until your horizontal reticle line is visually even and intersects the point of impact. (most scopes - counter clockwise)
5. Since your point of impact was right, rotate your windage knob in the "LEFT" direction until the vertical reticle line intersects the point of impact. (most scopes - clockwise)
6. Now, re-aim your rifle at the center of your target and fire one round. You should be very much closer, if not right on.
