We all know that our Junior Marksmanship program is the best around. We know that the program teaches safety as our number one priority. We then teach the proper fundamentals for many different disciplines including, rifle, pistol, trap, black powder and archery. But, have you ever thought about the other benefits of learning how to shoot? There is so much more than just becoming proficient with different firearms. To accurately shoot a rifle or any other firearm, requires the child to quiet their mind and concentrate on lining up the sights to the target. The child must slow their breathing and relax in order to squeeze the trigger at the right moment. Aiming a pistol takes large motor skills, proper trigger squeeze takes small motor skills, doing both engages the whole brain. Proper marksmanship is an exercise in body-eye-hand - mind coordination. This is a skill that is not easily attained and must be practiced.

Additionally, when you offer to teach a child to shoot, you are saying, I trust you, I know that you can listen and learn, I know that you can do it. In a world that often says that they are too young, or they can't be trusted, even ignored or belittled, especially when they ask about firearms, this is a huge confidence booster to these kids. I've seen it many times, when a child gets done with a Junior Marksmanship event, they walk taller, they smile more, they are more engaged in what is going on around them. They want to be that trustworthy person that they were just shown that they could be.

Does this transfer into other areas of their lives? Absolutely, we see these kids getting better grades in school, behaving better and wanting to get more involved in the world around them. Like I said before, they want to be that responsible person that we all know they can be. The idea that they are being allowed to do something, that for many people is forbidden, is very exciting to many kids.

The discipline and focus that marksmanship requires, combined with the stigma of firearms, can not only bring a new level of self-confidence, it can also improve the bonds of trust between the child and the adults around them.

The Junior Marksmanship program strives to make every event a learning opportunity. We do this by constantly "coaching up", by focusing on the good and working to strengthen the weaknesses. I want to thank all of the coaches that come out every month and work tirelessly to give our kids these opportunities.

TRAP CORNER

Range Improvements

We have a perfect storm brewing. Most of the electricity consumed at the Range is for the Trap machines and the Trap Lights. SDG&E is making matters worse by dramatically increasing the price of electricity from 4 PM - 9 PM. Rather than increasing the price of Trap and 5-Stand, we decided on another approach to reduce the cost of electricity. We are replacing the Trap light fixtures (16 x 1500w each) with brighter LED fixtures (16 x 500w each). We found a vendor in San Diego that can sell us the equipment for a reasonable price. At the time of this writing, we are working on selecting a licensed and bonded electrician to install the new fixtures.

Saturday Night Fun.

I want to recommend a new weekly practice that is going on at Trap on Saturday evenings. It started one Saturday afternoon while we were shooting Trap hand having a great time shooting 16-Yard Singles. Dan Doorman came over from the Pot Shooter's area and invited us to participate in a **Buddy Shoot**. After explaining how the game works, a few of us went over to give it a shot. In order to prevent any *Super Teams*, we were all issued a playing card after a good shuffle of the deck. The two people that were handed aces and made a team. The two people that were issued deuces became another team. This continued until everyone was on a team and had a location to stand in the line. In this game, each team (two people) has two shots to break each bird. Scores are calculated and ties are decided with a shoot-off. This whole game took about 20 minutes and we all had a great time.

Because the teams are randomized, we all get to meet someone new and have great fun while we are at it. If you are around on Saturday afternoon and you hear the announcement about a **Buddy Shoot**, give it a shot. It's a lot of fun and we all get to know each other better.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

As I have mentioned before, safety is the most important issue while on the range and we do have a set of rules that we all must follow to help achieve that goal. Some of the rules may be a bit ambiguous (wording is not clear), and some are on purpose to allow you to use some "common sense".

I will make it a priority to update the EFGA Range Manual and get a new copy published. Until then let me clarify a couple of items.

- If you have any range rule disagreement with a Range Safety Officer or get information you believe is incorrect, please follow their instructions, get their NAME (the old guy in the faded red shirt does not work) and let me know the details.
- Silhouette targets are allowed as long as it fits the paper target size for the range/frame in use. It must not look like a specific person (use some common sense here) and may not be a full size target that hangs off the frame.
- Short pistol range has a one target and size limitation. You may only have one target piece of paper, but that paper may have multiple "targets" on it. Remember all shots must hit the bank.
- Zombie targets are allowed; once again it may not resemble a recognizable person (that common sense thing again).
- Semi-automatic rifle legality and magazines with more than 10 rounds is the responsibility of the firearm OWNER. You may safely shoot any legal AR or AK (no steel core ammo), but YOU are responsible to make sure that it is legal.
- Concealed Carry Key word here is "Concealed", keep it that way. You want to show it to your buddy, take it to the firing line.
- Adding an audible indication that the range is Cold in addition to the current lights. Item is under BOD consideration and research.
- Firing line adjustment for Saturday night "Pot Shoot" Access from the 3 Trap ranges towards the Trap Club House will be blocked when shooting from the Trap Ramada Patio.

I was "accosted" at my local firearms dealer the other day by a few members and the owner in a lively discussion (thoughts of body armor flashed by)! I do appreciate a civil discussion regarding clarification of the rules and notifying me about range offenders; especially RSO's...

As this is new member season, I will once again put out the call for those of you who would like to volunteer as a Range Safety Officer. You will get a Red Hat and Shirt that will make you the envy of all your friends (I am still working on tasers). Please contact me for further details.

By the time you read this Range Master Appreciation Day (RMAD) will have passed. It is one day that all the Range Masters, Shoot Chairs, BOD, and a few others have our day of shooting (Ren always wins), Prize table (Ren always goes first, cause he always wins) and good food (we make Ren go last...). I have purchased extra band-aides and tourniquets for the hatchet and knife throwing events...

Cold Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights ON
- DO NOT handle Firearms & Equipment
- Handle Targets
- Sweep up brass behind the Yellow and in front of the Red line

OK TO GO DOWN RANGE

Hot Range:

- Blue Blinking Lights **OFF**
- Handle Firearms & Equipment
- OK to Load/Unload Vehicle
- Sweep up brass behind Red line

No Illegal Transactions may be advertised in this newsletter. It is now illegal to sell ammunition in California without either going through an FFL or a licensed ammunition reseller. EF&GA cannot facilitate any illegal commerce of a state regulated commodity. This is also why firearm sales should include a phrase similar to Buyer pays DROS when advertising the sale of a firearm.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

Sheep Dog Academy - Coming in October

Overview:

Sheepdog Academy is designed for EF&GA members with a current California CCW permit and current CCW insurance to participate in small group discussions about actively carrying a concealed firearm in California and live fire training. The event will include holster draw, threat and hostage simulations.

Requirements:

Must be an EF&GA member in good standing with a current California CCW permit and current CCW insurance. Permits and insurance will be checked. Members will be asked if they plan to actively carry their firearm. Personal carry insurance is to show responsibility and a serious desire to carry responsibly. As a sanctioned event the current green sheet will be the liability release. No fees will be charged.

Equipment:

Only firearms listed on the CCW will be allowed, this will be checked. Proper concealment holster, and mag carriers if desired. Ammunition will be factory loads only. Eye protection will be everyday glasses or clear eye protection. Appropriate ear protection is required. Everyday concealment attire is required. No fishing, trap vests etc.

Location, Days, & Time:

Trap Pad # 1. Academy will alternate between Saturdays and Sundays. Start times 7 to 8 am. Other days may be used.

Course of Fire:

This will not be a competition and there will be no timed courses of fire. Timers may be used to measure holster draw time. Holster draw will be concealed inside or outside the waist band at the three o'clock position. At this time all other draws (ankle, rear {four o'clock}, appendix, etc.) will be done with training (inert) firearms only. Cardboard IDPA targets will be used at three to seven yards. Shooters will go through various drills as discussed by the group



with the goal of assessing a situation, safely drawing from the holster, and bringing an end to the threat. All live fire drills will include an RSO.

Group Size & Ability:

Groups will be limited to eight to ten members at a time. Pre-registration will be required. Groups will be a mix of experienced carriers with those members new to the carry community and who want to ask questions, exchange ideas, and train to become a responsible carrier. If you are interested and meet the requirements, or have questions email me, Norm Porst, at nwporst@gmail.com I will notify anyone who is pre-registered by email when an event will be held. The first eight to ten respondents will be invited to that event. I will rotate rosters to give as many as possible a chance to join in.
