Darrin's Dissertation

We have a reputation at EF&GA of including safety as a critical part of our *culture*. Because we all know that using firearms is a lot like skydiving (you don't get a second chance to get it right), we do a lot of practicing specific behaviors to make safe practices become *muscle-memory*. For example, I have been known to keep my finger off the trigger of a cordless drill until my sights are aligned. Good habits like this minimize the risk of bad things happening when we are distracted or complacent for any reason.

Good *muscle-memory* habits come from practicing the behaviors when confronted with specific *mental queues*. In the example above, whenever I place a tool with a pistol-style grip in my hands, I put my trigger-finger straight along the side of the device (away from the trigger). Learning to identify these *mental queues* can help you convert a *good practice* into *muscle-memory* response.

One *mental queue* that I want to spread around and merge into our *culture* is to STOP when you are getting ready to unload your firearms from your vehicle and sign the Green-Sheet FIRST. You might think that the reason for this is some lawyer wanting to make sure that everyone is accounted for and such. While that is important, it is not the primary reason for this practice. When you sign the Green-Sheet, you also learn the condition of the range that you are about to use. If that range is COLD, you know that you need to wait until that range is HOT before unloading your vehicle.

Using the *mental queue* of unloading your vehicle to remind you to sign the Green-Sheet FIRST can prevent unsafe conditions. If we politely remind each other to practice this behavior, it will become part of our *culture*.

In other Association news, the new flagpole monument is coming along well. **Jack Starlin** applied for and received the permits and arranged the inspection of the foundation before the concrete was poured. **Gary Fukuda**, **Bill Welch**, **Richard Baugh**, and **Chris Cote** got the footing excavated, rebar assembled, and concrete poured for the foundation. At the time of this writing, they are working on building the forms for the parts that are above-ground. If all goes well, it will be complete for a dedication close to Veterans Day.

Now that the Membership has voted to proceed with the 100-Yard Remodel project, we will be looking for volunteers to help with many aspects of that project. I'm working on a web-based sign-up form to make the arrangement of volunteers easier. Stay tuned for future developments.

Target Markers on 100 Yard Range

As you walk down the 100 Yard range, you might notice some new markers in the ground at some odd distances. These markers, made from 12" square pavers, are stenciled with a chicken, a pig and a turkey silhouette and 40m, 60m, and 77m, respectively. They are placed to mark the location for setting the target racks for Smallbore (.22) Rifle Silhouette, eliminating the need to pace off distances from the target butts and guesstimate lateral positions every month. Bow Hunter Education Class 9/10/2022, 12/10/2022 (7 am - 4 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills, and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.


NRA Blended Pistol Class 9/22/2022, 10/25/2022 & 11/22/2022 (7 am – 4 am) Class Description:



On the Pistol Range, when you bag or unbag your firearms, do so on the Firing Line shooting bench. Do not bag or unbag your firearms on the middle tables or rear seating benches. Last month we had a member's guest handling a firearm on the middle table pointing the firearm at people that were standing at the Firing Line shooting bench. **Members – Pay attention to your guests**.

Last month on the Pistol Range, two handguns were left on the Firing Line shooting bench overnight. That could have caused a huge problem. Also last month a Shotgun was left in one of the Shotgun racks.

The Green Sheets: If you sign any of the Green Sheets and there is no "Date" and "Range" filled in, please fill them in. There are Green Sheets being turned in with no "Date" and "Range" information filled in.

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area.

Make sure that what you bring with you to the range, you also take back home with you.







BLACK POWDER NEWS

by Garth Warner

Muzzle Loading Bullseye: On 9/4/2022 there will be a 3 gun event. Pistol, Rifle, and Tradegun. Safety Briefing at 07:45, first round out at 08:00. Contact **Patrick Watson** for Details.

Primitive Archery: Following the above event there will be a Primitive Archery Field Course (Probably in the Campground). Start time will be 10:00 or following the 3 gun contest. Contact **David Premetz** for details.

Muzzle Loading Silhouette: On 9/22/2022 there will be a Stupid Short Range Silhouette Contest for Pistol and Rifle. Pistol targets will be at 15, 25, and 35 yards. Rifle targets will be 20, 35, and 50 yards. (Or thereabouts). This is a beginner confidence building course. If you have never competed with your black powder pistol or rifle, then this event is where you start. Because of the extremely short distances, there will be NO possibles medal awards for this event. Come out and have fun for a no pressure event. \$1 for each pistol entry. \$5 for each rifle entry (non-members \$10). Pistol starts at 08:30 and Rifle starts at 10:00 "ish". Contact Garth Warner for details.

Cowboy Action Shooters: If you have a muzzle loading percussion revolver, shooting Black Powder, and would like to try shooting beyond 10 feet, come on out and play. We also have a Black Powder Cartridge rifle category for targets out to 50 yards. Targets are roughly the size of paper plates and there is no speed requirement. There is NO period correct costume requirement for this event. The minimum clothing requirement is a loin cloth.

Area Forecast Discussion - San Diego: Current weather information can be found by Googling the above on your smart phone or computer. The information shows up as NWS Forecast Discussion San Diego Office. This is the source that the overly buxom weather girls use to present their "weather reports" on the evening news. It updates every 4 hours, or more often in severe weather events. It also includes a marine and aviation section. This report also includes a synopsis of several weather forecast models for the next week or so. Check it out.

How to Narrow Down the best load for your ML Rifle - AKA BALL and PATCH sorting:

Ok. Why do some of our rifles shoot like lasers, and others shoot like shotguns? Maybe you have not "Tuned" your ball and patch combo. Try the following to sort this out. Establish a base load for your rifle. As a rule of thumb, take the caliber of your rifle (50 cal), and add 20 to get 70. Start with 70 grains (by volume) as your test load of 2f or 3f powder. Lay out 5 patches that are .015, five patches that are .018 and five patches that are .020. Lay out 15 balls of the diameter of your choice. For a 50 cal rifle this will be .490 or .495 diameter. Shoot the first 5 with the .015 patches. Shoot from a bench using a rest. Use a good repeatable bench rest form. Measure the 75 yard group and patch up the target. Shoot the next five with the .018 patches. Measure and repeat until you have tried all the different patch sizes. Compare the results and identify which loading was the best.

NOT DONE YET:

If you used the .490 balls in the above test then switch to .495 balls and repeat. Compare the results and identify which loading was the best.

NOT DONE YET:

Take the best load combination you determined from the above and move on to evaluating your patch lube. Try liquid lubes. Try grease lubes. Which one was best for you?

NOT DONE YET:

Now you get to do the ladder test. Switch to a clean target. Lay out another 25 round balls. Firing from the bench, (and from a rest), shoot 5 rounds using 50 grains of powder. Measure and patch your target. Now shoot 5 rounds using 60 grains of powder, measure and patch your target. Repeat the above procedure for 70 grains and then 80 grains of powder. Evaluate which load was most accurate. You will most likely see groups starting wide, tightening up and then getting bigger again. Evaluate which charge weight was most accurate. Try 5 more rounds 5 grains UNDER that charge weight, and 5 more rounds, 5 grains OVER that charge weight. Somewhere in there your will find the sweet spot for YOUR rifle. This is your base load for THIS rifle.

NOT DONE YET:

You can further refine this process by trying the same test with different powders. If you used 2f powder, try the test with 3f powder. Which was better for you in THIS rifle?

NOT DONE YET:

Patch lubes are an arcane science. Call it VOO DOO of the lube. Generally, large volumes of lube, liquid or grease, are NOT a good thing. Feel free to experiment with different lubes in different moisture amounts. I can tell you from experience that WET patches will not work well and that dead dry patches will not work well. Find something in between that works for YOU, in YOUR RIFLE. Test and Practice to figure it out. Seal your patches in an airtight container (if using liquid lubes) between shots and between matches. Consistency is king. When you figure out what works for you, then you can show up at the next contest, huddle over your patch box, while cackling "My Precious"...... In this group of shooters you will not stand out......except for your accuracy.




