

Bow Hunter Education Class 9/14/2024 (8:00 am – 4:00 pm)

Class Description:

The Bow Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach bow hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to becoming safe and responsible archery hunters. The covered topics include basic bow and arrow nomenclature, safe bow and arrow carrying practices, distance-judging techniques, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, tracking skills, shot placement, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Most states in America require a Bow Hunter Education certificate in order to obtain an archery hunting license. The Bow Hunter Education Certificate does not replace the regular Hunter Education Certificate. Both are required in states that require them. The certificate issued is valid in all states requiring it, and is good for life. The Bow Hunter Course includes 3-D archery field shooting at various targets and distances, including using a ground blind and tree stand. Bring a bow, arrows and quiver. Traditional and compound bows are acceptable. Use field tips on the arrows, no broadheads for the course targets.

NRA Basic Pistol Class 9/22/2024 (8:00 am – 4:00 pm)

Class Description:

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class 10/5/2024 (8 am – 12 noon)

Ammunition is hard enough to find and expensive enough. Is there any better reason to learn to reload your own ammunition?

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1st session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 nonrefundable deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

RANGEMASTER SOUND-OFF

Safety First

Hello Everyone,

Due to safety concerns with the extension of the 100 yard range remodel and additional shooting benches, going forward Trap pad #3 will not be available for use when the 100 yard range is open for Casual shooting. The concern is that when someone is shooting from the far right benches on the 100 yard range and someone would be shooting from the far right shooting position on Trap pad #3, there would be a possibility of an accident.

There is a lot of new activity going on at the range. If you have a safety concern or any other items that you would like to talk to me about, you can contact me. We can discuss things in confidence and I can serve as an advocate to pass on the information to the Board Of Directors.

Guests

Members are responsible for their guests. You are allowed to bring two guests to the range with you. Pay attention to them at all times. If they are not in compliance with our safety rules, it is your responsibility to correct. If they can not be corrected, it's time to head home and that guest should be removed from your guest list.

Blinking Blue Lights

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on, do not unload firearms or gear. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot (blue lights off). Then you can unload your firearms and gear. The chart in the upper right corner of this page should help you keep the lights protocol straight.

The Green Sheets

Sign the Green Sheets when you arrive at each range. Check to make sure the "Date" and "Range" lines are filled in. If not, fill them in, please. There are still Green Sheets being turned in without "Date" and "Range" information.

House Keeping

All shooters must remove their targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take your targets home to discard. HAZMAT rules do not allow used targets to be discarded at the range. Look around and make sure you have all of your guns and gear. Too many guns have been left behind recently.

Wildlife


As always, watch for turkeys, deer and any other wildlife on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" and wait for the visitors to leave.



Today we held our Junior Pistol Event. We had 15 shooters and they all did a great job. Today was by far one of our best coaching days that we have had in a long time. All the coaches brought their "A" game and the shooters followed their lead. I saw huge improvements from the sight in period to the last rapid fire session. The safety was first rate with trigger finger discipline being nearly perfect. Even the weather decided to play nice today as there was a cool breeze on the range until just after we finished the last relay.



- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- 2. Never point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3.** Keep your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- 4. Know your target and the surroundings

I need to again mention **Staff Sergeant Xavier Greiss**. For those that don't know, Xavier has been a part of the range for over a year now. He has become a huge part of the Junior Program. Up until a few months ago he was stationed at Camp Pendleton. Now he is stationed in 29 Palms. That's about a 2.5 - 3 hour drive for those of you keeping score. **SSgt Greiss**, drove out on Saturday and slept outside in our primitive camping area just so that he could help with our Junior program. Muzzle Loading Silhouette Sept 22nd:

This is scheduled for a Super Short Range (With a Twist). If you are new to Black Powder Silhouette Shooting then this contest is for you. Super Short Range places the rifle targets at 25, 50 and 75 yards. It does not get any easier than this. If you have a ML rifle that has been hiding as the queen of your gun safe since the dawn of time, then dust it off and bring it out. You need your own supplies and gear, but we will help you if you have a problem.

As Part of this Contest, we are also holding the Neil Pisk Memorial Trade Gun Shoot concurrently. This is a category that allows you to shoot a Trade Gun in the normal rifle event with targets at 25, 50 and 75 yards. This will be the 3rd in the Trade Gun series.

Because this Rifle Contest is too easy for the few Master Class shooters that we have, I have decided to add a twist. Master Class shooters will shoot the same course of fire as everyone else. The twist is that all Master Class shooters will be required to use the BobCat Short Children's rifles that were donated to the Junior Muzzle Loading program. ALL of these rifles have been repaired and zeroed at 50 yards with 30 grains of 2F powder. We will provide the balls and patches (which you can use or not). You are free to use your own loading components as needed. There will be a short sighting in period on paper targets after the pistol contest so you can see where they shoot. This will take the "best gear" equation out of the shoot and show who is best at adapting to a "new" gun.

Master Class shooters will need to start working on their excuses now......

Constitution Day-September 17

It had been a long hot summer in Philadelphia for 55 delegates from 12 of the 13 new states. They had originally gathered in May of 1787 at the Constitutional Convention to amend the Articles of Confederation that had clumsily held the new nation together since 1781. The Revolutionary War had ended with the signing of the Peace of Paris on September 3, 1783. The Convention delegates quickly realized that they should scrap the Articles of Confederation and begin anew.

James Madison has been credited with writing The Constitution of the United States, and indeed he was the Chief Architect. Many of the concepts like "Separation of Powers" came from Madison's extensive research of governments which included the Magna Carta 1215 and the Code of Hammerabi cerca 1755-1750 BC. The 55 delegates, however, spent the entire summer deliberating and compromising to come up with the final document.

On September 17, 1787, one of the most important documents in the history of the world was signed by 39 of the delegates in attendance. Nine of the 13 states were required for the new Constitution to be ratified. Over the next 9 months, **James Madison, Alexander Hamilton** and **John Jay** wrote 85 essays under the pseudonym, "**Publius**". These Federalist Papers, explained the reasoning and purpose of various sections of The Constitution and were intended to persuade the remaining states to ratify the document. Several states pressed for the addition of the Bill of Rights before agreeing to the new government structure....a wise decision as it turns out. It wasn't until 1790, however, that the last state, Rhode Island, signed The Constitution of the United States of America.

So...On September 17 and every day, honor The Constitution. It has kept us free for over 234 years.
