Mark's Ramarks

As you can see we have put up new signs. They are in the meeting house, the bathrooms, the big shed, on all of the ranges and on the front gate. These are Prop 65 signs. Proposition 65 Act of 1986 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals known to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity. The law aims to inform the public about potential exposures and allow them to make informed decisions about their health. These signs are required by state law. If you remember they were on the wall next to the door in each of the bathrooms, before we had them repainted.

I don't know if you've all heard that some of the clubs in the area are temporarily banning the SIG P320. SIG Sauer has received reports of unintentional discharge of this striker fired semi-automatic pistol. Last month our Board of Directors had a discussion about whether or not the Association should temporarily ban the P320. After lengthy discussion the board voted not to temporarily ban the SIG 320 from the range. After talking with our Chief Range Safety Officer, **Gary Fukuda**, it was determined that if any of the shoot chairs wishes to temporarily ban the SIG 320, it is at their discretion. As further developments come from SIG Sauer and other resources, the Board of Directors may re-address this.

I know it's summertime and it's hot and dry, but autumn is just around the corner where we might get wet and rainy conditions. The Association is working with the county on a grant that will allow us to recondition the creek area passageways. The plan is to put more rocks on the roadways so that we will still be able to pass over the creek and not have the roadway washed out.

RECENT SAFETY ISSUES

Throwing Firearms and Magazines

Throwing firearms or loaded magazines on the ground is a serious safety violation and will not be tolerated. You will most likely be banned from the range.

Handling Firearms with People in Front of You

ANY handling of firearms is to be done on the firing line. No one should EVER be handling a firearm with people in front of them. This includes handguns, rifles and shotguns. Since there is no actual "Firing Line" when using the manual Trap Thrower, consider the Thrower to be the firing line. Never shoot from behind it.

Take Your Property Home

People are still leaving ammo, powder and other shooting related items at the range.

So You Want to be Junior Rifle Coach?

(Part One)

Changing A Junior's Point of Impact on the Target using Natural Point of Aim

A shooters "Natural Point of Aim" (NPA) is nothing more than finding a neutral position for a shooter that has minimal effect on shot placement from shot to shot, to enhance consistency. For Junior Rifle events, our shooters are placed in the prone position. They utilize relatively heavy .22 caliber rifles. The rifles are supported under the forearm of the stock with sandbags. In the rear they are supported by the shooters shoulder and, in many cases, by the shooters "off" hand under the heel of the stock. This can vary in detail depending on the shooter and/or on the rifle. The shooters should be prone, roughly 15 degrees to the left of the centerline of the rifle (opposite for left handed shooters) and legs extended in a slight "V" for stability. Feet should be extended or flat to prevent the shooter from attempting to "Push" themselves into position using their toes (common with young people trying to wrestle a heavy rifle).

How to Find NPA:

There is no one position that is correct for every shooter. Place the shooter in the position identified above to get started. Have the shooter sight in on the center target, so that the bull's-eye is centered in the front and rear sight. Now tell the shooter to close his/her eyes. Tell them to move the rifle slightly to the right, then slightly to the left, then back to center. Have the shooter open his/her eyes and report which side of the target the front sight is on. Whichever side of the target the front sight was on, have the shooter move his/her waist and legs 3 to 6 inches in THAT direction. If the front sight was to the right of the bull's-eye, then move to the right. If the front sight was to the left of the bull's-eye, then move to the left. Repeat the test until the front sight is roughly centered on the target, moving the shooter as necessary.

Now fire your test shots at the center target. They should be somewhere in the black. Note that if your shooter is shooting consistent groups on target you can now "fine tune" your shooter's shot placement by moving them slightly side to side, WITHOUT changing the sights on the rifle. This technique works for elevation adjustments as well. Have the shooter MOVE UP on the sandbag to raise the group elevation. Have them MOVE BACK on the sandbag to lower the group elevation. NOTE: Always make sure the forearm of the rifle is resting squarely on the sandbag. DO NOT allow the shooter to position the rifle in any fashion where the front sliding sling adjustment is resting on the sandbags. This will be inconsistent and cause the rifle to be grossly inaccurate.

If your test groups are satisfactory, then repeat the NPA process for EACH of the "For Score" Bull's-eyes as you proceed through the match. If your shooter breaks position during the shooting string (bio break, stretching, etc.) then you get to start the whole process over again. Once the shooter understands the process it should go rapidly.

The Target Rifles used by our Junior Rifle program are maintained, and serviced, by cranky old men who put a lot of effort into making them work as well as reasonably possible. When you, as a coach, report that a rifle is not zeroed, these old dudes spend their lunch break getting the rifles ready for the next relay. Not surprisingly, the majority of zeroing problems for rifles returned during the relay are a direct result of somebody "adjusting" the sights to move a group one inch or less. Now you know how to "move" your shooter's groups, without touching the sights.
