ALL STEEL TACTICAL RIFLE MATCH June 8th, 2013

Attention Semi-Auto Rifle Enthusiasts! Come on out on Saturday, June 8th, 2013, and join us for our all steel, rapid fire semi-auto rifle match at 8:00am. Bring your AR-15, AK, M1 carbine, or other semiautomatic rifle. Acceptable calibers are .223/5.56, 7.62x39, 30 carbine, 5.56x39, 9mm and 45 ACP. Please NO 308's. Sorry M1A guys! NO rimfires. Please note that all rifles must comply with California law. No steel core or armor piercing ammunition is allowed. Make sure your AK ammo passes the magnet test. The course of fire will be four, 18 round stages, so bring 100 rounds of ammunition. Distance - 50 to 100 yards. Shooters will need 3 mags and 2 mag pouches or cargo pants to hold their magazines.

The assault on our Second Amendment rights continues with anti-gun bills moving through the California Legislature. Unfortunately, there are several anti-gun bills that have been scheduled to be considered on the state Senate and Assembly floor with more anti-guns bills scheduled to be heard in their respective state Senate and Assembly committee. Please call and e-mail your state Senator and Assemblyman, along with members of the respective state Senate and Assembly committee urging them to OPPOSE the anti-gun measures below. The following anti-gun bills have passed in their house of origin and are pending committee assignment or a committee hearing in the opposite legislative chamber.

Senate Bill 475 (Leno) requires the prior approval of the board of supervisors of both the County of San Mateo and the City and County of San Francisco to allow a gun show at the Cow Palace. SB 475 passed in the state Senate by a 25 to 13 vote on May 2 and is now waiting to be scheduled for a hearing date in the state Assembly Public Safety Committee. We will inform you when this date becomes available.

Assembly Bill 169 (Dickinson) BANS the sale of handguns not on the state-approved roster. This bill is so flawed that the provisions will BAN the sale of millions of old and used handguns CURRENTLY owned by Californians by dealers and PRIVATE PARTY transfers. AB 169 passed in the Assembly by a 43 to 27 vote on May 2 and is now waiting to be scheduled for a hearing date in the state Senate Public Safety Committee. We will inform you when this date becomes available.

The following anti-gun bills are awaiting a vote on the Assembly floor and could be heard at anytime. Please contact your state Assemblyman and respectfully urge him or her to OPPOSE these anti-gun bills. Contact information for your state Assemblyman can be found here.

Assembly Bill 180 (Bonta) repeals California's firearm preemption law by granting Oakland an exemption to enact unique laws regarding possession, registration, licensing and subjecting gun owners to unknowing criminal liability when travelling through Oakland.

Assembly Bill 231 (Ting) expands the law for Criminal Storage of Firearms and child access. Another bill that will do nothing to reduce California's violent crime problem and only turn law-abiding gun owners into criminals whether or not anything harmful actually happens, and regardless of whether there was any misconduct on the part of the gun owner. Ultimately, AB 231 is an ill-conceived proposal that places drastic and unprecedented liability on those who choose to exercise their fundamental rights to keep and bear arms.

Assembly Bill 711 (Rendon) BANS the use of all lead ammunition for hunting. For more information about AB 711, click here. AB 711 passed in the Assembly Appropriations Committee by an 11 to 5 vote on May 8 and will now move to the full state Assembly for consideration.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

While working around the pistol range the other day, I decided to count the bullet holes in the roof. I stopped counting at about forty-two and I am quite certain that I missed a few. Need I say that this is not acceptable? A bullet in the roof is dangerous to say the least and it does not happen by accident.

Anytime a firearm discharges when it should not is because someone did not follow one of the most basic tenets of handling a gun. Do not put your finger on the trigger until the gun is pointed at the target and you are prepared to fire. This never happens by accident. It happens because of inattention and sometimes inexperience. I will remind you older shooters, you have no excuse and newer shooters need to remind themselves over and over until it becomes second nature. If you bring a guest to the range it is your responsibility to make certain that they are properly schooled in the proper handling of firearms. I am looking for an assistant Chief RSO. Among other things the Asst. will be the training coordinator and fill in for the Chief at Board Meetings if I am unable to attend for any reason. Interested parties should contact me at CRSOTim@AOL. COM.

There are red steel painted containers located at each range. These containers are dedicated to disposal of DUDS. They are not for cigarette butts. I cleaned them out last week and could not believe the number of cigarette butts inside. There are also green containers specifically for cigarette butts at each range and at the Meeting Hall. If you are color blind or completely crazy, please feel free to ask an RSO which container is which. I am certain you will be quickly escorted to one!

Please keep in mind that the RSO Corps is made up of volunteer members. They are to follow the same rules as the general membership. The red hat and shirt means they have received special training on the safety rules of our club. Every member should know the rules, but they do change from time to time and EF&GA rules may vary from those at other clubs. RSOs are also trained to be polite as possible. Any disagreement with an RSO can be appealed to me or the BOD; however the RSOs word is final at that time. Arguing with an RSO is not encouraged.

Last but not least we try to keep some statistics on range usage, etc. The problem is that all too often no one has bothered to put a date on the range signup sheets. Shooters...for insurance purposes among others, make certain there is a date on the sign-up sheet! RSOs if there is no date I cannot give you credit for working a shift. Make certain there is a date clearly marked.
